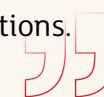
Getting Started

- Overall and prerequisite GPA minimum 2.5

Observation Hours:

- Recommended–50 observation hours under a Certified Athletic Trainer

Graduate Record Examination (GRE):

- GRE scores are not required.

The Master of Science in Athletic Training (MSAT) program is scheduled to begin in Summer 2021 (May 25, 2021).

Applications will be accepted through the Athletic Training Centralized Application Service (ATCAS) starting July 2020.
